

#### INTRODUCTION

This tech-tip provides information/examples on what is needed when staging pictures. As a rule of thumb, it is better to take multiple pictures from multiple angles and distances. Getting good quality photos will help response times and minimize the need for retakes.

#### **GENERAL TIPS**

- Hold your phone horizontal when taking pictures. Holding it horizontal will show more detail then holding the phone vertical.
- Make sure the damaged area is in focus, staying as still as possible to prevent the picture from becoming blurry. If needed, invest in a Tripod or stand to assist with this.
- View photos on a computer before sending. If the pictures are blurry or you cannot determine the amount of damage, then retake the photo.
- Be aware of the total size of the pictures when emailing them in. Most systems have a limit on the size of attachments. To email Terex, the attachments must be under 20 Mb in size. If you have additional pictures to share, sent an initial email, then send additional pictures into the case as needed.

#### **CHANGE IPHONE SETTINGS**

If using an iPhone, you might need to change the camera settings format for Terex to send pictures over email.

#### STEP 1

To change setting in iPhone, go to the settings lcon.



#### STEP 2

Scroll down until Camera settings are visible.



#### STEP 3

Go into formats:



#### STEP 4


Tap on the most compatible. This will change the file type to make sure its viewable via email.



#### **STEP 5 - STEEL CRACKS**

Take pictures at a distance from the damaged area to show where the crack is located.





#### STEP 6

Sand away paint around the crack, then apply dye penetrant if crack is not visible to highlight the crack. **Figure 7** 

**Note:** Use dye penetrant per the manufacturer's instructions.

#### STEP 7

Note the measurements of the crack. Write the measurements on the steel with a paint marker. **Figure 8**
